Derbyshire Cricket County Club	DCCC have provided termly coaching session for children during PE lessons – upskilling teachers on the skills and knowledge of cricket. Termly afterschool cricket club with an expert coach. The chance to watch live cricket matches at the cricket ground.

Progressive Sports	The partnership with Progressive Sports in providing an expert sports coach working alongside out teachers to upskill elements of PE and coaching in sports.	The change of sports coaches to do the sessions.	The new or newer sports coaches were not familiar with the schools routines and children had to adjust to new face more often than preferred.
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Intended actions for 2024/25

What are your plans for 2024/25?	How are you going to action and achieve these plans?
Intent	Implementation
Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.	The sports coach from Progressive Sports provides team teaching and coaching for all staff to build their knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport.
The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.	The children at school all have 2 PE sessions: KS1 30 minutes each and KS2 45 minutes each. These sessions are taught through the sports coach and class teachers. In addition, children are encouraged to engage in physical activities when the school day starts, break, and lunch and after school clubs. The school will signpost families to organisations/clubs which offer opportunities for physical activities outside of school.
Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.	PE and sport across the school has had its profile highlighted and raised through various initiatives such as inter house in sporting competitions and sports day. The children in all year groups have opportunities to attend and participate in PE and sports events. In

	addition, each week PE champion certificates from each class are celebrated during our collective worship (celebration assembly).
Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.	The PE and sports curriculum offers at the school ensures all children experience a broad and balanced range of sports. The wide range of sports are offered through the PE curriculum as well as through sporting events and competitions. The enrichment offer at the school provides opportunities for unique sports such as archery, kurling, material arts, boxing, and glow in the dark football/dodgeball.
Increased participation in competitive sport.	The participation in competitive sport by the children has been exceptional with them attending and participating at least 1 competitive sport event throughout the year. However, most children attend and participate in more than 1 competitive sport event which are held by varied organisations.

That all teachers are able to use the team teaching and coaching skills to deliver very effective PE and sports sessions.	This will be captured through staff and pupil voice in PE and sports sessions. Also, during general quality assurance of teaching and learning.
To continue to ensure all children are getting their entitlement of physical activity and more.	Timetabled PE sessions and sports enrichment. Parent and pupil voice.
The profile of PE and sport across the school has been highlighted and celebrated.	PE champions, celebrating sporting events, inter house competitions and development of the playground space.

The PE and sports curriculum provides a wide-ranging experience of a range of sports and activities throughout the PE and sports curriculum.

Complete PE scheme fully resourced with sports coach from Progressive Sports.
